- III. DNEA Training Update
 - a. New DNEA Implementation Coach
 - i. Nicole Ferrara comes from the state of NY where she was a teacher.
 - ii. Nicole Garrity, who was an implementation coach at the DNEA, has accepted a faculty position within the School of Education at UD and is leaving the DNEA.
 - b. Practice Traffic Stop program
 - i. The first event was held in July at Lums Pond State Park in partnership the Delaware Natural Resource Police, Delaware State Parks, and New Castle City Police Departments.
 - 1. The program was well-received, with around 20 participants and positive feedback from attendees.

- e. Isabel River Green brought up the topic of the timeline for the Blueprint, noting that it had been created 11 years ago.
- f. Dawn Maloney questioned what the objectives are, and how do we cross collaborate across agencies? Where do we stand as a state now?
- g. Isabel Rivera Green shared that the Maternal Child Health Title V -CYSHCN has introduced Blueprint for Change for the CYSHCN. This may be something that can be looked at and meet or reach gaps.
- h. The importance of cross-agency collaboration and the need to challenge ourselves to address big objectives was discussed.
- i. Katie, Meredith, and Alisha are going to meet and discuss what the next steps are going to be. They will then email the ICA members about where we go from here.
- j. Mary Whitfield made a motion to create a document so all agencies have access and can make updates, allow access to update and edit, and to share the Blueprint.
